The School recently renovated its existing facilities in Dudley Hall. There are 450 students in the undergraduate Architecture, Interior Architecture and graduate Landscape Architecture programs.

The School Head provides oversight of "on campus" and remote, immersive design and research programs including: Rural Studio in West Alabama, Urban Studio in Birmingham, Alabama and academic centers in Rome, Italy and Istanbul, Turkey. The Head of the School works closely with 35 faculty and staff, and is the liaison to the Dean's Office in the College of Architecture, Design and Construction, as well as the heads of the other two schools within the college.
