The School of Architecture, Planning, and Landscape Architecture (APLA) in Auburn, Alabama, is accepting applications for a one year (nine month / two-semester) non-tenure-track position as a Visiting Faculty. This position is based at APLA's Rural Studio program in Newbern, Alabama, and begins August 16, 2015.

The responsibilities of this position include teaching a design-build studio at the Third Year level of a professional Bachelor of Architecture degree program, and courses in related subjects including construction technology, history, and contemporary issues related housing and design theory. The successful candidate will work closely with the Directors and staff of the Rural Studio program. The location of instruction is Newbern, Alabama.

Requirements for this position include: a master's degree in architecture or other terminal degree in a related field. Preferred qualifications include: evidence of outstanding design skills, experience teaching in a professional architecture degree program via design-build teaching methods, and professional registration. Salary and academic rank will be competitive and commensurate with prior university-level teaching experience and qualifications.
