OUTREACH

The Local February – June 2019

In Spring 2019, 4th Year Interior Architecture students from Auburn University worked with 2nd Year Architecture students from Tuskegee University to propose an adaptive reuse of the historic Sullivan Building in Selma, AL. The studio worked closely with the co-founders of The Local, a cooperative restaurant and community garden. Options proposed by students are being assembled into a digital and printed book.

Elba Theatre February – June 2016

In Spring 2016, 4th Year Interior Architecture proposed an adaptive reuse of the historic movie theater in Elba, AL. In coordination with the community non-profit Restoration 154 and pro-bono architects Lord Aeck Sargent, students facilitated a community visioning workshop. Options proposed by students were assembled into a digital and printed book. Armed with images and models from the studio, Restoration 154 won a \$30,000 Cultural Facilities Design Grant from the Alabama State Council on the Arts in June 2016. In June 2017, the council awarded an additional \$50,000 grant towards Phase I construction, and a \$261,000 Community Development Block Grant was awarded in January 2019.

Montgomery City County Libraries May – November 2012

In 2012, Interior Architecture Thesis proposed a speculative renovation of the E. L. Lowder and Rufus A. Lewis branch libraries. The studio worked with the Montgomery-City Country Library Board of Trustees and the Friends of the Montgomery City-County Public Library. A final exhibit installed simultaneously at both branch libraries (August – November 2012) presented a range of options to these two communities. Final presentation boards and a printed catalogue were also presented to the Montgomery City-County Public Library.
